




### **ISUCF'V'MB to travel to France**

## **Pep Band Recap**

The 2015-16 Alumni Pep Band season was another fun one! It started off very early this year with a summer practice session! What do you mean "we don't need no steenkin' practice"? That may be true as an individual, but it's hard to add new music as a group without it!

So we got together for an hour and a half practice session on July 18<sup>th</sup> and coupled that with a potluck lunch. It was a great time, gave us an opportunity to start to include some recent varsity alums in the group and set the stage for adding a few songs to our repertoire. In fact, some of that music is available <u>online</u>.

The music is in the Pep Band folder and the password to log in is *gocyclones!* We encourage you to go online, check out the music and let's try and add these to the books for next year!

The first event of the year was a VB match on the same day as the TCU football game as the Cyclones also took on the Horned Frogs at the net. Since the Varsity Band had another engagement that same day, the Alumni Band was asked to fill their shoes. Despite being few in numbers, we still played well and cheered them on to a not-too-tough 3-1 victory!

The next game was supposed to be a WBB tilt against the New Orleans on

Sunday, November 22<sup>nd</sup>, but "travel problems" prevented the Privateers from making the trip to Ames. The game was not rescheduled.

Our first men's contest of the season for the Alumni Pep Band was against the Chattanooga ("Choo, Choo!") Mocs, as part of the Emerald Coast Classic. The ECC was a tournament the Cyclone eventually won in Destin, Florida. What's a Moc you ask? Check out this <u>link</u> to answer that interesting question. While the Cyclones were never able to completely derail UTC, they still worked hard for an 83-63 win.

The schedule tweaked again when the VB match against Baylor was moved up to November the 24<sup>th</sup>. But that didn't faze the pep band or the Cyclones as we were able to send three very successful seniors out on a high note (rim shot) with a 3-1 win over the Lady Bears. Again, it was a strong performance by the band, despite the small numbers participating.

The first post-Thanksgiving game was on 12/20 and was a women's basketball game against Alcorn State. (When did we add Alcorn as a state?) With the postponement of the New Orleans game, this was the first opportunity for the pep band to experience the new four-quarter women's game format. The change-up in the foul counting and the addition of two more opportunities to play "ISU Fights" between quarters didn't throw us too much, and in the end we were able to help "Celebrate" a Cyclone victory over the Lady Braves 91-41.

The final (and very well attended by the pep band) men's game was against Coppin (still not a) State. While it was a tad crowded in the percussion section, we still were able to work in a four-drummer rotation, which included a song or two with Steven Smyth at the set. As far as the game went, ISU jumped out to an early double-digit lead, led by 16 at the half, broke the 100-point barrier for the second time in the regular season and cruised to a 104-84 victory over the Eagles. Fan favorite Stuart "Stuuuuuu" Nezlek even got into the action with two points. A good win for the Cyclones!

The ISU Alumni Pep Band closed out another perfect season with the January 2<sup>nd</sup> women's conference game against Oklahoma State. Points were hard to come by, but thanks to "Kidd" Blaskowsky playing lock-down "D" on OSU's top scorer Brittney Martin, the Cyclones earned a hard-fought 49-42 decision. The win marked the first time the Cyclones had beaten the Cowgirls after losing the four previous contests.
